Dear Sirs,

I am in receipt of a memorandum from the Society's Liverpool Office stating that the Steam Trawler "UNITIA" was sold about two months' ago to the River Ness Fishing Co. Ltd. of Aberdeen, no survey having been carried out prior to the ship's departure from Fleetwood where she had hitherto been laid up.

You will appreciate by reference to the Register Book, that this vessel is considerably overdue for Special Survey, and that a notation of "Laid up pending survey" appears in the class. I shall, therefore, be glad if you will ascertain without delay what steps are to be taken to carry out the Special Survey advising me by return of post in order that the matter may receive the consideration of the Committee on Tuesday next.

I have to add that although the Liverpool Office state the ship is now the property of "George Craig, the River Ness Fishing Co. Ltd" of Aberdeen, the Register Book entry indicates that Craigh Stores (Aberdeen) Ltd. are the Owners, and I shall, therefore, be glad to learn whether any amendment is necessary in this respect. It is, of course, appreciated that the two firms concerned are associated, and operate under the same Management.
