We beg to acknowledge the receipt of
your Classing Letter of the 8th instant regarding the
case of S.S. "MATHEOS", Vancouver Report No. 8323.

With reference to your instructions that
we should issue an amended Interim Certificate making the
Classification subject to the life boats being dealt with
at the earliest opportunity, we regret that it was not made
clear in the Report that the two forward life boats are in
satisfactory condition. It is understood that these two
life boats are sufficient to meet life saving requirements
but as the two after life boats were found to be in poor
condition it was recommended that they should be dealt with
at the first opportunity but we were in doubt if we would
be in order in making this recommendation a condition of
Class.
