Dear Sirs,

With reference to the S.S. No. 670 building by your good selves, I have to inform you that a telegram has been received from Messrs. Swan, Hunter & Wigham Richardson, Ltd., reading as follows, namely:-

"maximum draft to scantlings approved under deck tonnage
"800 sheer forward 3 feet six inches aft one foot six

and they have been furnished with a memorandum setting forth the freeboards which have been provisionally assigned to this vessel.

For your information a copy of this memorandum is enclosed. The freeboards in question are subject to the particulars and dimensions now supplied being verified on completion of the ship, to the ends of the erections being closed as required for full allowance, to the round of beam being equivalent to the standard, and to the sheer being of the gradual character defined by the regulations.
