the undersigned Surveyor to this Society did at the request of Messrs. Kawasaki Kisen Kaisha, Ltd., survey the M.S. "FLORIDA MARU", 5845 tons gross, of Kobe, on the 13th April 1940 and subsequently, whilst the vessel lay in dry dock at Messrs. Mitsubishi Jukogyo Kaisha, Ltd., Kobe, for the purpose of examining the repairs to damage stated to have been caused by collision with the T.M.S. "KANSAI MARU", on the 29th January 1940, whilst leaving Kobe for a voyage to Seattle, via Yokohama.
