S. With reference to your report No.12394 on the steamer "STRIVER", I have to acquaint you that the Owners have called at this Office asking to be furnished with the classification certificates as soon as possible. They stated that they had arranged with the builders as regards the fees. The builders in a letter addressed to this Office dated the 20th ultimo, state that they are agreeable to the certificates in question being handed direct to the Owners in this City. I therefore telegraphed you to-day as follows. viz:-

"STRIVER BUILDERS REQUEST CERTIFICATES BE HANDED SHIPPING INVESTMENTS LIMITED HERE STOP WIRE WHETHER FEES PAID IF NOT ARRANGE OBTAIN PAYMENT AND WIRE."


