5860 tons gross, of Kobe,
on the 23rd December, 1940 and subsequently, whilst the vessel lay
afloat and in dry dock at Messrs. Mukaisima Dock Yard Co., Onomiti,
for the purpose of ascertaining the nature and extent of damage
stated to have been caused by touching with M.S. "NISSIN MARU", in
heavy rain and typhoon on the 26th August, 1940, whilst the vessel
lay afloat at No.12 Buoy, Yokohama Harbour.

For further particulars see Log Books and Yokohama
Damage Reports dated the 27th August and 18th September, 1940.

Port side stem plate in the 4th strake below sheer strake, indented.

Three frames with brackets in way, slightly buckled.

Port side shell plating in way of side bunker amidship in the 2nd and 3rd strakes below sheer strake, indented.

Port side shell plating in the 2nd strake below sheer strake between Nos. 4 & 5 hatches, slightly indented.

Lengths of guy ropes for derrick, broken.

Coil of wire rope (3 1/2" circ.) hanging anchor with one shackle (3" dia.) broken and lost.

Length of chain stopper, broken.

Hook for buoy (3" dia.), lost.

Cork fenders with ropes, lost.

RECOMMENDED

To be faired in place.

1 frame and bracket to be removed, faired and refitted.
2 frames and brackets to be faired in place.

All removals necessary to effect repairs to be replaced in order: shell repairs be pressure tested and proven tight and faired parts be recoated where necessary on completion of repairs.

The foregoing recommendations were made in order to place vessel in as good a condition as before the damage was sustained have now been carried out satisfactorily with exception of three shell plates on port side marked thus (+).
