I beg to hand you herewith an account for the fee due for the survey during construction of the hull of the Wood Screw Drifter "GREY SKY" recently completed by Messrs. J. & G. Forbes of Sandhaven, this account being sent in accordance with the instructions received from the Director of Contracts in a letter dated the 25th February, 1919, reference No.10243/19/G/3537.

In addition to the usual fee for the survey during construction of the hull, an account is also enclosed for the survey held on the vessel on account of damage sustained whilst proceeding from Dundee to Fraserburgh after the installation of the engines at the former port. As you are aware, the vessel struck a rock off Girdleness in March, 1920 and was subsequently placed on the Sandhaven Slipway where the necessary repairs were effected, and the damage fee and expenses as shewn on the account herewith are in connexion with this survey.
