In reply to your letter of the 6th, of September regarding the S.S. "PORSANGER" Montreal report 1522 I have to state that the upper deck beams <sup>clear</sup> ~~are~~ of the bridge were of channel section equivalent to these approved, and also that the reverse frames at the ~~after~~ ends of the vessel were as shown on plans. The center girder top angles were as mentioned in my report 3.5 x 3.5 x .46 and on referring to the approved midship section at Vickers I find that they are there noted as being reduced to .46 at the ends. The inner surfaces of the bottom plating are protected by cement.

The certificates for the forgings and castings were forwarded with my first entry report to New York, and I am writing to them regarding them.
