With reference to previous exchange of correspondence relative to the subject of overdue Surveys in consequence of change of Ownership of the above named vessel I beg to advise you as follows.

A suitable letter was sent to the new Owners at Bahia Blanca on the 30th April last, concerning the overdue Surveys but no reply has been received.

We have on various occasions contacted the Managers at Buenos Aires, who appear unwilling to carry out any Surveys and refer us to the Owners for further information.-

Early last month I went on board the vessel whilst laid up at Buenos Aires, and the conditions so far as seen appeared generally satisfactory. Shortly afterwards she sailed and is now engaged on coastal fishing service. I feel that the new Owners have no desire to retain the Glass, and they have made no effort to comply with the Rule requirements.

A letter has today been addressed to the Owners intimating that I have recommended to the Committee that in view of the circumstances the notation of Lloyd's R.M.C. be expunged from the Society's Register Book.

At the same time they were requested to state whether they desire to retain the Classification of this vessel and if so to submit proposals for dealing with the overdue Surveys.

After allowing a short period to receive a reply to this enquiry I will advise you further, but recommend meanwhile that the notation of Lloyd's R.M.C. be expunged from the Register Book.
