Mr. Scott,

I understand from Mr. McGilvray that the first vessel has been completed at Aberdeen and reported and an account for the fees has been rendered.

On enquiry Mr. McGilvray tells me that about half of the survey work has been carried out by him. The sailing expenses in connection with the survey of this and other Concrete Vessels have so far amounted to just under £200, in addition Mr. McGilvray's salary has been charged to the above accounts.

In these circumstances I would suggest that a portion of the fees (say $\frac{4}{5}$ ths) should be credited to this account for the first vessel and that the other cases ^{in Scotland} should be similarly dealt with as they arise.
