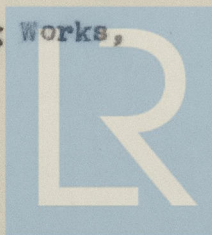
The rectangular coupling is preferred to the alternative coupling of circular form, for in the latter case the distance between the bolts is such that it is considered probable the faces of the coupling will not be brought close together and corrosion will result. If, however, the Owners desire to adopt the alternative coupling this could be approved, provided the arrangements be modified on the lines indicated on the plan.
