Kokusai Kisen Kabushiki Kaisha., survey the Steel Single Screw Steamer "Y U R I M A R U", 6787 tons gross, of Kobe, on the 28th June 1940 and subsequently whilst the vessel lay in dry dock at Mitsubishi Hikoshima Dock, for the purpose of ascertaining the repairs of damage stated to have been caused by collision with a lighter on the 14th December 1939 at a Port whilst the vessel was being moored alongside a pier.

For further particulars see Kobe damage report, dated the 16th December 1939.

The undersigned upon examination in dry dock.

FOUND.

The 3rd rudder arm from top fractured at a distance of about 18" from the centre of the main piece and its pintle bent.

The rudder plate bent.

The rudder main piece slightly bent.

RECOMMENDED.

To be renewed.

To be removed, faired & refitted.

To be removed, faired ~~xxxxxx~~ and refitted.

To effect the above repairs, the rudder lifted, the 4th, 5th, and 6th rudder arms from top, renewed, and grease packing renewed in the stuffing box.

The above recommendations were made in order to place the vessel in the same good condition as before and have now been satisfactorily carried out.
