In answer to your letter of the 16th inst., with regard to the First Entry Report on the Steel Twin Screw Motor Vessel "ARDOR", Messrs ANSALDO SAN GIORGIO No 206, we have to say that the shell connections of the side and bottom transverses as fitted in the ship in the cargo oil tanks were formed of two angles, one 150 x 150 x 12 m/m and the other 90 x 90 x 11 m/m.

By a clerical error the scantlings of the 150 x 150 x 12 m/m angle was reported as 150 x 90 x 12 m/m of which we express our regret.

We have your letter of the 15th inst.

in relation to the proposed alterations to the hull of the ship.

The alterations proposed are as follows:

1. To increase the length of the hull to 115 ft.

2. To increase the breadth of the hull to 22 ft.

3. To increase the depth of the hull to 12 ft.

4. To increase the draught of the hull to 12 ft.

5. To increase the displacement to 100 tons.

6. To increase the speed to 12 knots.

7. To increase the range to 1000 miles.
