Dear Sir,

I beg to acquaint you that the Committee of this Society have given their careful consideration to your letter of the 16th instant regarding a number of Admiralty trawlers (about 40) which are still laid up awaiting sale.

In reply to your enquiry as regards the surveys becoming due on these vessels under the Society's Rules, I have the pleasure to enclose herewith for your information a list of the trawlers referred to containing the dates of the last Special Survey if any, and the dates when the next Periodical Survey will become due in each case.

The Committee note that these vessels are docked annually, and that opportunity is afforded the Society's Surveyors to be present upon the occasion of the dockings, and in the circumstances I have the pleasure to say that while the trawlers remain laid up the Committee will be agreeable to the Periodical Surveys taking place upon the occasion of the annual dockings as desired, the classes of the vessels remaining undisturbed in the meantime.
