The Vessel was examined in Dry-dock, the hold, peaks, engine & boiler spaces and bunkers being cleared and all ceiling lifted.  
The deck, masts, rigging, hatches, ventilators, windlass, steering gear, hand pumps and connections and general equipment were examined.  
The chain cables were ranged and examined.  
It was not considered necessary to drill-test the shell plating.
