Dear Sirs,

I am in receipt of your letter of yesterday's date respecting the steamer "ISONOMIA", and in confirmation of my telephonic message this afternoon, I have the pleasure to say that in the circumstances you mention the Committee will not object to the vessel proceeding from Ipswich in ballast to Libou, subject to the Third Special Survey No.1 being carried out on her arrival at that port.

It is noted that she will take bunkers at the Hook of Holland on her passage to Libou.

In this connexion, I think it well to add that the Society's Surveyor at Riga is being authorised to carry out the survey, but in view of the previous reports received on the vessel and of the importance of the present survey it will be necessary for Mr. Bulow, the Principal Surveyor for Sweden, who resides at Gothenburg, to join in the survey.
