With reference to the classification in the Society's Register Book of the steamer "ISONOMIA", I beg to acquaint you that I am in receipt of a letter from Messrs. W.L. Comyn & Co., Inc., who state that the sale of this vessel is being negotiated.

In this connexion, I may say that the Third Special Survey No. 1 became due on the steamer in December last, but only part of the machinery survey has been held. In addition some indented bottom plating forward requires to be dealt with and a bower anchor supplied. Further, when the vessel was under the inspection of the San Francisco Surveyors in December, they recommended, on account of the condition the vessel was then in, the Special Survey should be carried out after the discharge of her cargo.

The case has received the consideration of the Committee, and I have to say that as the vessel is laid up, they have agreed to the class remaining undisturbed for the present subject to your undertaking to complete the necessary survey and repairs before the steamer proceeds to sea, if she remains your property, and should she be offered for sale.

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that you will inform intending purchasers that the class is allowed to remain, subject to this being done.
