Repairs &c.

The class of this vessel is subject to indented bottom plating forward being dealt with at the Owners' convenience and to a bower anchor being supplied.

The San Francisco Surveyors reported in December last that the vessel had been placed in commission after having been laid up for 21 months. The steel and wood decks were considerably deteriorated and the Surveyors recommended that the 3rd S.S.No.1 due 12,26, be held after discharge of cargo.

The Owners at Seattle stated in February last that the survey would receive attention on the vessel's arrival on the other side.

The vessel was reported to have arrived at Ipswich on the 4th May and on the 19th the Owners representatives in London stated that nothing had been decided in regard to the carrying out of the survey, but a cablegram had been sent to the Owners and their decision was awaited.

The Owners' representatives now state that it has been decided to sell the vessel.

It is submitted action be deferred and the Owners asked to furnish the usual undertaking.
