Dear Sir,

With reference to the Glasgow first entry report No. 39014 on the three boilers built by Messrs. A. F. Craig & Co., Ltd., I have to inform you that the Society's Surveyors at Leith report that these boilers have now been fitted into the s.s. "SUNFIELD", Messrs. The Burntisland Shipbuilding Co's No.103 vessel.

I enclose herewith a copy of a letter I have to-day addressed to the Society's Surveyors at Leith respecting the question of the fees chargeable for the survey of the hull and machinery of this vessel, from which you will see that of the ordinary classification fees chargeable to the Engineers, Messrs. Douglas & Grant, £11.5.5 will be credited to your port for the survey of the boilers, and of the proportion of the fee chargeable in respect of the survey of the boilers as for a Standard vessel, £6.2.1 will be credited to your port, making a total of £17.5.4 which is the full amount of the fee for Standard Boilers for this type of vessel, the gross tonnage being 3108.

I shall therefore be glad if you will kindly see that the necessary entries are now made in the Glasgow Rough Fee and Debit Books in the usual way.
