## CERTIFICATE FOR ENGINES AND BOILERS.

This is to Certify that the Engines and Boilers of the  
Steel Screw Steamer "Hardenburg" ex "Stahleck"  
163½ Tons, of Amsterdam  
Built at Bremen in 1923  
have been surveyed at Amsterdam  
in November 1946  
by the Surveyors to this Society, and reported to be in good,  
efficient, and safe working condition, at a pressure of 199 lb  
per square inch on the main boilers. The approved working pressure  
of the donkey boiler is ✓ lb. per square inch.

The survey having been completed, the Record LMC 14.46  
(Lloyd's Machinery Certificate) has been made in the Register  
Book, subject to Periodical Surveys as required by the Rules, and to the  
spare gear being completed, and also to a direct bilge suction of  
about 80mm. bore being fitted to the ballast pump.
