Dear Sir,

I beg to inform you that the Haugesund agents for the new owners of the steamer "BRISSAC" telephoned me last night and informed me that it had been decided to have this ship registered in Liberia but this registration could not take place until a declaration was issued by me to the Liberian Consul at Oslo to the effect that the class was still L.R.

As I do not know whether the class has yet been withdrawn by the old French owners I informed the Agents that I could not issue such a declaration without asking for your instructions.

The Agents also stated the ship was to be reclassified American Bureau but the Liberian Authorities would not accept a declaration issued by the American Bureau until ship was actually classed by them.

I therefore at the request of the Agents for the new owners cabled you last night as follows:-

"BRISSAC NEW OWNERS STATE SHIP WILL BE REGISTERED LIBERIA AND NO REGISTRATION CAN TAKE PLACE UNTIL I ISSUE A DECLARATION THAT SHIP IS CLASSED L.R. TODAY OR TOMORROW. STOP. MAY I ISSUE THIS DECLARATION. STOP. CLASS WILL BE TRANSFERRED TO A.B. PLEASE CABLE REPLY TUESDAY".
