CERTIFICATE FOR THE CARRIAGE OF CARGO OIL IN BULK.

the undersigned Surveyor to this Society did at the request of


Messrs. Nippon Yusen Kaisya, survey the "D" Deep Tank of the Single Screw Motorship "NOTO MARU", 7191 tons gross, of Tokyo, whilst the vessel lay afloat at this port.

The "D" Deep Tank was tested on the 17th December, 1940, by a head of water to the top of the air pipes 3 feet above weather deck, and upon examination, the boundary bulkheads, tank top, hatches, ventilators and other connections were found sound and tight.

The Double Bottom Tank in way of this Deep Tank was tested on the 18th December, 1940, by a head of oil fuel to the top of the sounding pipes on the weather deck and found sound and tight.

The heating coils in the Deep Tank were tested to twice the working pressure and found tight.

This Deep Tank is considered fit to receive a shipment of Cargo oil in bulk for the contemplated voyage subject to examination for cleanliness before loading.
