This trawler was built for the Admiralty in 1943, and classed #100A- "Stm Trawler" "For Government Service".

The TORQUAY Surveyor reports, 4,48, this vessel examined in drydock, bottom coated, and the requirements of a PERIODICAL SPECIAL SURVEY (A), due 5,47, complied with.

The Trawler has been converted to a passenger and cargo carrying vessel for the War Office, in accordance with approved plans. (See specifications and correspondence).

A watertight door has been fitted in the after E.R. bulkhead, giving access to the shaft tunnel.

IT IS SUBMITTED the vessel is worthy to have the amended class #100A- assigned, with particulars as noted on endorsement 5,6,43, amended as below now inserted in R.B., with record of docking survey 4,47 and notation of S.S. Ply - 4,48.
