The remarks contained in the third paragraph of your letter of the 18th July regarding the ships belonging to Djawatan Pelajaran have been noted with interest, and in view of your recommendation it has been decided to allow the ships' classes to remain in the Register Book for the time being.

The cases of the "BOGOWONTO" and "BRANTAS" have been deleted from this fleet, and I am sending a statement setting forth the present position regarding outstanding surveys.

So far as Docking Surveys are concerned the Committee, generally speaking, do not object to a postponement up to eight months, and up to six months for a Modified Survey of the Oil Engines, but I have to draw your attention to the cases of the "KAKAP", "MUTIARA" and "PUSPARANGAM". In the first case the Special Survey became due at the end of June last, and we will require to know as soon as possible the Owners' intentions regarding the carrying out of this inspection.

In the cases of the "MUTIARA" and "PUSPARANGAM" the periods of grace for the Special Surveys will expire shortly and definite arrangements should be made for these inspections to be held if the ships are to remain in class.

No doubt you will endeavour to arrange with the appropriate Authority for the more pressing cases to be dealt with as soon as possible.
