Dear Sirs,

Reverting to Mr. Nolson's letter of the 13th March last from Crecy en Brie and to my letters to you of the 31st March and 19th ultimo respecting the classification in the Society's Register Book of your Steamers "SCHELDEDIJK" and "SCHELDESTAD", I beg to acquaint you that, in the absence of a reply to the enquiry contained in my letter of the 31st March, the Committee have to-day given instructions for the classification of both vessels to be withdrawn from the Register Book, and three dots (...) inserted in lieu in each case, indicating withdrawal of class at Owners' request.

I have to add that in view of the withdrawal of the classes of these vessels, the records of the freeboard assigned by the Committee, together with the corresponding draughts, will also be withdrawn, and the freeboard certificates are thereby cancelled and should be returned to this Office.

I should add that since the receipt of Mr. Nolson's letter of the 13th March, it would appear that you have acquired the Steamer "SCHELDESOP", and in the circumstances perhaps you will kindly let me know whether it is your wish that the classification of this vessel also should be withdrawn from the
