

DOLOMITE MARINE CORPORATION (in bankruptcy)

The fees and expenses referred to in the attached letter from Mr. Bennett, dated the 18th December, 1941, are as follows:-

New York	Classification Survey of m.v. "DOLOMITE 4"	/\$ 2750.00
Philadelphia	Miscellaneous testing	/ 106.25
Pittsburgh (non-exclusive A/c)	-do-	/ 204.25

These amounts have been outstanding in the Society's books since the beginning of 1939, when this Corporation went into bankruptcy.

Attempts were made by the New York Office to recover these sums from the Mathieson Alkali Works, who foreclosed a mortgage on the "DOLOMITE 4" in April, 1939, and eventually became the Owners of the vessel.

On the 29th March, 1940, Mr. Bennett forwarded a copy of a letter addressed to him by the Mathieson Alkali Works offering the sum of \$750 in settlement of the Society's accounts on condition that the classification certificates were handed over and the vessel's class inserted in the Register Book. This offer was not considered acceptable, and it was subsequently learned that the Owners had decided to class the vessel with the American Bureau.
