This vessel, which was built in 1938, for classification 100A1 Carrying petroleum in bulk, For Service on the Great Lakes etc., has had the classification withheld on account of the non-payment of fees owing to the bankruptcy of the original Owners.

Correspondence has since taken place with the new Owners, Mathieson Alkali Works, Inc., regarding the settlement of the outstanding fees, and it was pointed out that non-payment of fees was likely to entail the loss of class.

The class is subject to suitable drainage being arranged in the double bottom tanks at the first convenient opportunity.

A report from the GALVESTON Surveyor, transmitted by Mr. Bennett, has now been submitted for the consideration of the Committee. The vessel has been placed in dry dock, the bottom coated and minor repairs effected.

Attached is a letter from the Master in which it is stated he understands the Owners have decided to class the vessel in the American Bureau. He adds "Please send your bill for Survey at Beaumont to our Lake Charles office and they will send you a cheque".

The case is submitted for the consideration of the Committee.
