Dear Sir,

With regard to the S.S. "SAINT ROMINIQUE" No. 81992 in the Register Book, the Builders now state that the vessel has been sold to the Union Steamship Co., of New Zealand, and is at present undergoing a general overhaul, and the Builders are at present carrying out minor alterations to suit the Owners requirements. The coaling hatches in the Bridge and upper deck are being increased and as the watertight bulkhead comes in way of the hatch on the upper deck suitable compensation has been made. The arrangement has been carefully considered with the Builders and is such as could be submitted for the favourable consideration of the Committee. The Builders are most desirous to proceed with the work and have started cutting away, and desire approval at the very earliest.

The structural plans for the vessel are with the First Entry Report. Structural plan showing alterations to coaling hatchway is enclosed.
