I have to inform you that I have to-day had a visit from Mr. Livingstone of Livingstone & Cooper, Ltd, who states that the s.s. "SAINT ROMINIQUE" No. 81992 in the Register Book has been practically sold to the Union Steamship Co., of New Zealand, the sale being subject to a satisfactory trial trip.

The date of build of this vessel in the Register Book is January 1922, and the prospective Owners desire to know in view of the fact that the vessel has never left the Builders' yard, if it is possible to obtain a later date of build. They desire that the date of build be as late as possible, and Mr. Livingstone informs me that they are prepared to place the vessel in drydock and subject her to a general examination, and open up any parts considered necessary, it is also contemplated to fit a tween deck in the holds.

I shall be pleased to learn at your early convenience the Committee's decision regarding this matter, and Mr. Livingstone

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requests would you please also convey the decision of the Committee
