CONTINUATION OF SHIMONOSEKI DAMAGE REPORT

This is to Certify that

the undersigned Surveyor to this Society did at the request of

Messrs. Syoyo Syosen Kabusiki Kaisya, survey the

S.S. "KISO MARU", 4071 tons gross, of Kobe,

on the 29th June 1940 and subsequently whilst the vessel lay afloat and in dry dock at Tama for the purpose of further ascertaining the nature and extent of damage stated to have been caused by the vessel striking some submerged objects on the 20th March 1939 whilst on a voyage from Kushiro to Niike.

For further particulars see Log Books and Shimonoseki Damage Report dated 2nd April 1939.

To be removed, faired and refitted.

Starboard Side.

No.1 plate in 3rd below sheer
strake, cracked in two places.

To be renewed.

No.2 plate in 3rd below sheer
strake, badly indented.

To be renewed.

No.1 plate in 4th below sheer
strake, badly indented.

To be renewed.

Nos.1 & 2 plates in 2nd below
sheer strake, indented.

To be removed, faired and refitted.

No.1 plate in 1st below sheer
strake, slightly set in at the
lower seam.

To be faired in place.

Frames:-

15 frames on Port Side and
17 frames on starboard Side,
buckled.

To be faired in place.

It is further recommended that all removals for access to
be replaced in good order, all new and disturbed work be recoated,
fore peak tank be tested and shell repairs be hose tested on completion.

The foregoing recommendations were made to place the vessel
in as well as a condition as before the damages were sustained, and
repairs have now been completed to my satisfaction.
