We confirm our cable (DLT) of yesterday's date and enclose copy thereof.

This Vessel arrived in the Roads on the 12th. instant, but has not yet entered Port due to the fact that the Owner's Agents here have no money and are unwilling to risk bringing in the ship and having her embargoed.

We yesterday called on H.B.M.Consul General who informed us that the crew's wages amounting to some £4100 sterling had not been paid and he was fearing that the crew might lodge a protest and refuse to continue on board in view of this and also that the articles had lapsed.

She is said to be due for classification survey which should apparently have been held long since

The whole affair appears to be rather hopeless and nobody appears to be taking the slightest interest either on behalf of the ship or cargo wherefore we telegraphed to you and trust that we have not acted wrongly in so doing.
