Repairs on account of Damage (the cause of which must be stated) should be separated from Repairs due to other causes; and besides being detailed in the body of the report, should be summarised in the form shown below. Whenever the replacement of Anchors or Chains is reported, the particulars should be clearly stated in the space provided on the back of this form. State also the dates and initials of any letters respecting this case.

REPAIRS, OR EXAMINATION AS PER RULE, FOR Docking and Completion of Survey for Classification, see Secretaries letter III. dated 21st July 1909. Now done:

Vessel placed in dry dock, the bottom and rudder cleaned examined and coated. Top of engine and boiler casing and the engine room skylight riveted. Tunnel top with stiffeners and one stiffener on coal shoot bulkhead riveted, and all caulked and painted as necessary.
