and that we have transmitted to the Committee of Lloyd's Register of Shipping, London, a Report stating that all repairs recommended by us have been completed to our satisfaction, and that we have recommended that she be assigned a record of "Examined L.R.S. 45", subject to Tail shafts being drawn and examined at first opportunity, and to the Liquid Cargo carried by the vessel having a flash point above 150°F.
