Trasatlántica Española, S.A., dated 23rd July, 1960.

Dear Sirs,

steamer "HABANA"

Our ship of reference will finish today her discharge operations in the port of Alicante and will proceed then to the port of Vigo where she will be provisionally laid up until an improvement in the present conditions in the international market of freights.

We shall be glad if you will kindly let us know whether it is necessary to carry out immediately the Boiler Survey, which it is now outstanding, or if in the contrary you would be able to wait until the ship is ~~again~~ put into service.

It would be our wish to obtain from that Society a postponement for this visit in order to avoid us the corresponding expenses in the case of the ship not going any more in active service.

If this postponement is not possible, we would carry out that visit in the port of Vigo where the ship will be laid up.
