Steamer "HABANA"

The case of the above named ship has received the consideration of the Committee today together with your letter of the 18th May.

The Committee are somewhat concerned to note that the completion of a Boiler Survey, which became due last October, may have to be postponed until July (nine months after the due date). They have been informed that the survey was started at Cartagena last March (Valencia report No. 1088) when the Surveyor was advised by the Owners' representative that arrangements would be made to complete the survey in the near future. The ship apparently then sailed for Havana, which port she has not yet left, and the Committee are of opinion that the Owners should make greater efforts to complete the survey before the ship leaves Havana.

The position is, however, not clear and the Committee have instructed me to make certain enquiries of you, as per the cablegram which has been despatched this afternoon. They desire to review the case at the meeting to be held on Friday next, 10th instant, and I trust that by then you will be able to furnish me with the desired information.
