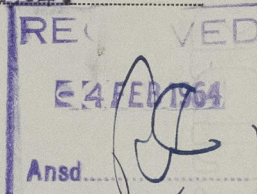

M.V. "ALBACARA".

We refer to our answer dated 27th instant to your Memo. of the 6th. and would now inform you that Owners have indicated their desire that our Class as from the 31st. January 1964 be permitted to completely lapse.

It is our knowledge that this vessel will as from now be classed B.V. which Classification Society has we are reliably informed accepted their new responsibility by external examination in Drydock, cursory inspection of anchors and chain cables and changing of screwshaft, vessel at moment of writing afloat having left Drydock P.M. to-day.

No Hull structural repairs of importance have been effected during this vessel's short duration in Drydock, it being known that Owners had previously approached local Representative of B.V. with whom they have external connections, with the view of his assured recommendation of acceptance into that Classification.

In the unlikely event of Owners having second thoughts in that they desire to comply with our Rule requirements we naturally will inform you immediately by cable.
