Dear Sirs,

Motorship "NAYMERE"

This ship is classed #100A1 "With freeboard"  
"For service in the Baltic and Mediterranean, European  
Coasting including Great Britain and Ireland but north  
of 50° N in Summer season only".

A letter has been received from the Secretary,  
at New York from which it would appear that for some  
time the ship has been trading outside her service  
limits and, in fact, it is noted that she is now under-  
going Special Survey at your port.

It would appear that the new Owners desire the  
service limits to be amended so that the vessel can  
trade on the eastern seaboard of North America as far  
north as Newfoundland, and as far south as the northern  
coast of South America, and if this is so structural  
alterations may be necessary.

I shall be glad if you will give me particulars  
of the new Owners and let me know the service in which  
the ship is to be employed so that the scantlings can  
be considered here, and recommendations made for any  
strengthening considered necessary.

This is considered to be a matter of urgency and  
your early reply to this letter will be appreciated.
