Air pipe from No.2 D.B. tank (SS) split (approx. 4") in first length of pipe above tank top.

RECOMMENDED


First length of air pipe above tank top (approx. 13'-0" long) to be renewed.

The foregoing recommendation was made with the view to restoring the vessel to the same state of efficiency as ascertained before the alleged casualty.

The repair was satisfactorily carried out at this time by the Kyobashi Kikai at a total cost of ¥ 59,200.00 which is considered fair and reasonable.

The damage in the opinion of the undersigned is consistent with the stated cause.
