127 to be renewed.

Two broken rivets in bilge shell
clear of tank margin.

To be renewed.

One margin vertical angle in way
of No.4 Tank.

To be reriveted.
Tank margin angle to be
recalced in way of new
rivets.

Three margin plate butts in way of
No.4 D.B.Tank.

To be recalced.

To be recaulked.
Fourteen tank side brackets
to be removed for access.
Bilge ceiling for 47 spaces
to be removed for access.
D.B.Tanks Nos.2,3,4 & 5 to
be retested. Bilge cement
to be renewed for 44 spaces.

tops of bottom shell leaking.

About 950 rivets to be
hardened up.
About 400 feet of caulking
to be overhauled.

order to place the vessel in good condition.
