EXAMINATION AND REPAIRS AS PER RULE FOR Occasional Docking, Collision Damage Repair, Change of Ownership.

The vessel was docked at this time for underwater examination prior to change of ownership to Messrs. San Raimundo Compania Naviera S.A., of Hong Kong.

DOCKING:— Bottom, rudder etc. found or placed in good condition. Not recoated. Four slack rivets in rudder arms renewed.

COLLISION DAMAGE:— It was stated that the stem of the vessel had struck the wharf when berthing at Osborne, 17th August, 1961. On examination, stem bar found set over slightly between the 8ft. and 10ft. water marks, shell plating port and starboard sides buckled for 3ft. vertically and 1ft. horizontally. Buckled plating cropped and renewed stem bar faired. Fore peak tank tested and found tight on completion of repairs.
