Admin. Dear Sirs,

We are advised by Messrs. Niarchos Ltd. that they are proposing to increase the deadweight of their "MOBIL RADIANT" class of ship from 28,000 to 42,000 tons by increasing the depth so that the upper deck is at the level of the present poop and by inserting a three tank section 135 ft. long amidships.

Four of the ships are classed with Lloyd's Register and three with American Bureau, and since it is obviously more economical to have one set of plans for the conversion, Messrs. Niarchos have more or less decided now to transfer the A.B. ships to L.R. class on the occasion of the conversion. The work will be done at Skaramanga.

The question of the fees to be charged has been under consideration and Messrs. Niarchos have been advised that a fee of £900 per ship will be chargeable for the conversion and £700 for the reclassification of the three A.B. class ships, making a total of £7,000 in all for the seven ships.
