We thank you for your letter of the 31st of January 1963, R., together with the two enclosed copies of letters dated the 7th and 31st of January 1963 from and to the Surveyor at Bangkok, in connection with the attendance of an exclusive Surveyor at Bangkok, to join in the Special Survey at the end of April or the beginning of May 1963.
