Dear Sir,

Further to my letter of the 14th instant I have been advised by Mr. W.A. Souter that it has been decided to class the Steamer "SAMMEX" with the Society, and that she is expected to be in London Port for discharge on Monday next, 21st inst.

He desires that as much as possible of the necessary surveys be carried out then, when it is understood registration with the British Authorities is also to be undertaken. He has been advised that a survey for Freeboard Assignment and a General Examination could then be held.

We shall be glad therefore, if the necessary arrangements can be made for this case to receive attention on the ship's arrival.

It is noted from the instructions of May 1946, relative to American built ships, that a temporary class will be granted subject to General Examinations being held annually until the due date of the first Special Survey. In this case the Owner particularly desires not to delay the vessel for Special Survey at this time, and it has been assumed that, provided the Special Survey is held before the ship is 5 years old, temporary class can in the meantime be obtained by General Examination, but I shall be glad if this can be confirmed.
