An enquiry has been received from Mr. W.A. Souter relative to the classing of the Steamer "SAMMEX" at present classed with the American Bureau and recently purchased.

He evidently heard that there is some advantage to be obtained by classing the ship with the British Corporation, primarily in respect of scantlings. With a view to assuring him that this is not the case, will you kindly inform me what is the position in this respect.?

It has evidently been stated that the British Corporation will accept the ships more or less as they stand, and for that reason perhaps you will kindly detail what will be necessary for the Society's Classification.


