Dear Sir,

I have to acquaint you that the Committee have had under consideration a number of reports received from the American Committee of partial surveys held, with a view to eventual classification or reclassification on arrival in this Country.

As a general principle, and with a view to meeting existing conditions, they have agreed in such cases to the assignment of the following notation in the Register Book, viz:

Classification or Re-classification contemplated

Examined - with date - (in red).

The Committee have today assigned in the case of the steamer "OAKWOOD", Mobile report No.1680 a notation of

100AL Shelter deck with freeboard
Reclassification contemplated
Examined 1.40

and in the case of the steamer "SAN LUCAS" a notation of

100AL Shelter deck with freeboard
Reclassification contemplated
Examined 1.40

In the cases of the "DELAWAREAN" and "LOUISIANIAN", it is proposed to adopt the same procedure, with the exception that in these cases the wording, of course, will be:

Classification contemplated,

and you will be advised in due course of the final decision as the partial first entry reports and plans forwarded by you have been investigated.
