When due.....

A letter dated the 20th August, 1954, from New York forwarded a copy of a communication from the Owners dated the 9th August, 1954, and in which they intimated their desire to withdraw this vessel from the Society's class.

The ship was at that time under survey in Baltimore and the Classification Committee decided to await the Surveyors' report before dealing with the case.

The Baltimore Surveyors' report has now come to hand and states that, in the course of a survey in drydock for damage, the screwshaft was found defective and recommended for renewal. The Owners could not agree to renew the shaft as recommended by the Surveyors and decided to withdraw the vessel from class. It is understood that the screwshaft has not been renewed as recommended and that the Owners are negotiating with the Bureau Veritas with a view to their classification.

In view of the fact that this vessel has a reported defect and so far as is known has not been dealt with, this case is submitted for the consideration of the Committee.
