Surveyed the S.S. "FORT FERROT", 7171 tons gross of London,  
on 19th September, 1944 whilst lying afloat at Irwell Park  
Wharf, M.S.C., and subsequently whilst in Drydock and afloat  
at Manchester, on account of damage stated to have been  
caused by enemy action on 27th July, 1944

and that I have transmitted to the Committee of Lloyd's  
Register of Shipping, London, a Report, stating that all repairs  
recommended by me have been completed to my satisfaction, and

that I have Recommended that she be continued as classed in  
the Register Book with fresh record of survey 5,45, subject  
to cargo battens being completed in after holds and 'tween  
decks at first opportunity. The class of the vessel is also  
subject to bower anchor to supply and two bower anchors and  
stream anchor on board to submit to Statutory test at end of  
present emergency

being fit to carry dry and perishable cargoes.
