We request that the Committee of Lloyd's Register will instruct the Society's Surveyors to Specially Survey during Construction the Hull, Engines and Boilers of the Vessel No. 639 building by Messrs. C. VAN DER GIESSEN & ZONEN for Messrs. C<sup>IA</sup> SHELL, Lisbon of a gt 560 Tons. Length 165'-0" Breadth 28'-0", Depth 12'-3" intended to be Classed + 100 A1 carrying petroleum in bulk

We undertake to arrange for every facility to be given to the Surveyors to carry out the duty in question, and we agree to pay the fees for the Surveyors' services, in addition to the actual travelling and other expenses incurred by the Surveyors in connection therewith.

This request is made upon the terms of the Rules and Regulations of Lloyd's Register of Shipping, which provide that:—
