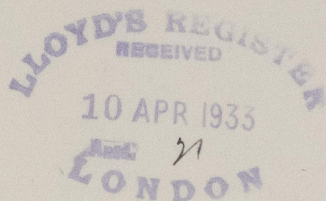

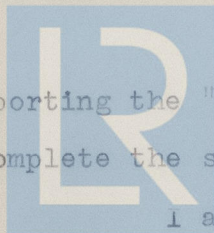

I pressed the Owner to complete the Special Survey No. I and he agreed to do so and promised to let me know when he was prepared, but I have received no further word from him and I understand the vessel has gone to sea.

He also promised to write to me about the "Cierto" which is at present at sea, but I have so far heard nothing, although I told him that unless the surveys now due were carried out at once, he would in all probability lose the class.

I have delayed reporting the "Canosa" in the hope that I would be able to complete the survey but I shall now prepare the report.
