I acknowledge receipt of your letter of the 29th ultimo and note the contents.

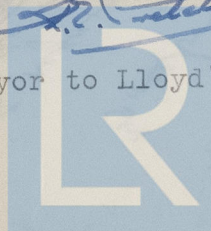
In reply to the queries contained therein I have to advise you as follows:-

- 1) The flush scuttles to the void spaces (1p 1s) are of the bayonet type of securing, made of malleable cast iron and supplied by Messrs. Loveridge Ltd., of Cardiff.
- 2) The air pipes are all protected by the bulwarks and the minimum height to the bend of the goose neck is 24 inches.
- 3) Enclosed herewith are 'As Built' plans of Midship Section, Profile & Decks - one set for each ship.
- 4) Anchor certificates - other than the Proving House Certificates - were not received in these cases, but as the anchors were ordered to Lloyd's test and inspection it is concluded that the weight of the anchor head including pins etc. is not less than 60% of the total weight of the anchor.
